The Program Manager, Community Health Improvement will provide technical assistance for current activities related to population health. The Manager will work with partner community coalitions and organizations to manage and coordinate programs and services.

QUALIFICATIONS:

EDUCATION AND/OR EXPERIENCE: Master's degree and 1-3 years' Public/Community Health experience or Bachelor's degree and 5-7 years' Public/Community Health experience.

DUTIES:

- Serves as the liaison and channels communication between the appropriate community partners.
