

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Q.	What type of organizations can apply?
A.	501c3, non-profit, agency, government, education, etc.

Q. Can one organization submit more than one proposal? A. Yes. If an organization wants to fund two separate projects (one for physical activity access and one for social connectedness) two separate proposals for up to \$9,000 each can be submitted.

Q.	Can one organization submit one proposal that addresses both projects?
A.	Yes. If an organization wants to address both physical activity access AND social
	connectedness in one project, one proposal for up to \$18,000 can be submitted.

Q.	Is there a minimum amount that organizations can apply for?
A.	No.

What is physical activity access? Enhance equitable access to safe places for physical activity and essential travel through plan development and community engagement. A. The National Association of Chronic Disease Directors has identified the senior population to be at high risk for social isolation. Therefore, the data showcases where the 65+ population resides.

A. No. However, we do encourage applicants to be as concise as possible and to focus on answering the question directly.

Q. Any tips on how to complete the application?

A. We suggest downloading and completing the RFP document and templates first. Then, when ready, copy and paste responses into the online application.

Q. What is the timeframe for the BRIC opportunity?

- August 6, 2021 Proposals Due
- August 9-19, 2021 SC BRIC Proposal Review
- By August 20, 2021 Recipients Notified
- Week of August 23-27, 2021 Recipient Meeting/Agreements Initiated
- August 30, 2021 December 10, 2021 Implement Proposed Projects (16 weeks/4 months)
- By October 22, 2021 mid-project written progress report due
- December 15 or 16, 2021 SC BRIC Community Showcase Meeting (serves as final report)

Q. Do the projects have to address COVID-19 directly?

A. No. However, the project types being addressed are a focus due to the results of COVID-19. This RFP is intended to address high-risk, medically underserved, and rural populations.
