The Data Analyst will coordinate all data and information collected on behalf of the South Carolina Office of Rural Health. The Data Analyst will work with internal teammates to drive the data collection, analysis and reporting relied upon to improve the overall health and wellbeing of rural communities in our state and maintain information management platforms.

QUALIFICATIONS:
